



Make it Reasoning Activity Cards Set 2 - KS2

These activity cards are designed to develop learners reasoning skills. The aim of the activities is to encourage thinking, mathematical discussion and reasoning. Regular use of the activities will support learners to explain their thinking and prove their ideas. The activities can be used for whole class discussions, group work or individual challenges and can be part of a lesson, homework challenges, or a standalone alone activity such as settling children down after play.

These cards focus on time and develop the following reasoning strategies:

I know... so I know...

What's the same? What's different?

Always, sometimes or never

Odd one out

Spot the mistake

Do I fit?


I know Tom got up at 10.









